Did you know...

Grease in the wastewater pipes causes:

- Sewage overflowing in your home.
- Expensive and unpleasant cleanup that often must be paid by you the homeowner.
- Sewage overflowing into parks, yards, and streets.
- Customer rate increases to cover higher maintenance costs for cleaning grease from wastewater mains.

How to...

Maintain healthy wastewater pipes:

- Never pour grease down sink drains or into toilets.
- Always put grease and food scraps into a can and then into the trash.
- Put baskets/strainers in sink drains to catch food scraps and other solids and then empty them into the trash.
- The best way to dispose of cooking grease is to collect it in a container, let it harden, seal the container and then put it in the garbage.
